Dwelling time

For the assessment of dwelling time per room, 2759 measurements were taken. It should be noted that not every single measurement represents a single visitors. Sometimes the dwelling time of one visitor was analysed in more than one room. It is estimated that the dwelling time of approximately 215 different people in different rooms was measured. The overall dwelling time was specifically measured analysing 28 extra individuals.

The time needed to go from room to room was measured by the assessors to be approximately 3 minutes. This gives an overall dwelling time of 32 minutes for tourists and 45 minutes for Nationals.
