This symposium accompanies the exhibition *Holy* Image, Hallowed Ground: Icons from Sinai (on view at the I. Paul Getty Museum, November 14, 2006— March 4, 2007). The exhibition presents objects from the Holy Monastery of Saint Catherine at Mount Sinai, Egypt, the oldest continuously operating Christian monastery in existence and home to one of the world's finest collections of Byzantine icons and manuscripts. Revealing the central role of the icon in Orthodox devotion and religious practice during the Byzantine era, the exhibition also considers how Saint Catherine's geographic and historical position as an imperial outpost and a major pilgrimage destination contributed to the formation of its astonishing holdings of icons and books. Icons, manuscripts, and precious objects used in the celebration of the liturgy, all from Saint Catherine's, are on view. Important loans are also being provided by Dumbarton Oaks, the Galleria Estense of Modena, and other institutions. The exhibition is organized by the J. Paul Getty Museum in partnership with the Holy Monastery of Saint Catherine at Mount Sinai and the Supreme Council of Antiquities, Egypt.
