

Key Land of Myth – Homer's Odyssey RPG characters

Characters and common English pronunciation of their ancient Greek names:

Telemachos: (Τηλέμαχος) Tell **EH** ma koss Trickster; son of Odysseus, King of Ithaca (Odysseus was famous for his cleverness and trickery)

Ctimene: (Κτιμένη) Kti **MEH** nay (It's not you! Saying KT is hard for English speakers) Warrior; queen of Same (**SAH** may); younger sister of Odysseus / aunt of Telemachos Her warrior status is unusual for a Homeric female, so this is an innovation within the game (Mentioned in *Odyssey* book 15.363)

Peisistratos: (Πεισίστρατος) Pay **SIS** tra toss Warrior; son of King Nestor of Pylos (Mentioned in *Odyssey* book 3.37)

Halitherses: (Ἀλιθέρσης) Hal ih THURR sees Seer; an Ithacan prophet who interprets signs and omens (Mentioned in *Odyssey* book 2.158)

Phemia: (Φήμιa) **FEE** me ah (an invented character) Trickster; her name is based on the word for speech and rumor/fame, Φήμη. She is assumed to be a faithful member of Odysseus's household

 Phemius (Φήμιος) is a bard in Ithaca. (For him, the "speech" root connects to his sung words, for her, to manipulating speech. The two are not related.

Theoris: Thee OR iss (an invented character)

Sorceress from Thessaly, an area known for centaurs and witchcraft

 Θεωροί (usually generalized as male) were official spectators at religious events and witnesses of special sights and spectacles; as individual pilgrims they hoped for insight from a divinity

Seven Thebes sometimes uses the transliterated Greek rather than Latinized spelling of names, for example Kyklopes instead of Cyclopes. Using the common English pronunciations is fine: Cyclopes: **SIGH** clope eaze.
