

## Works of Art



Description: Painted plaque with Medusa head, Sicilian Greek, 225-200 BC.

Description: Furniture support representing a winged feline, Tartessian, 700-575 BC.

Description: Engraved scarab, Greek, early 5<sup>th</sup> century BC.

Description: Scaraboid, Greco-Persian, mid-5<sup>th</sup> century BC.

Description: Attic red-figure kylix, Greek, about 380 BC.

Description: Statuette of Nemesis with portrait resembling the empress Faustina I, Roman, about AD 150.

Description: Griffin Protome, Greek, about 650 BC.

Description: Hand mirror decorated with the head of Medusa, Greek (South Italian), 500-480 BC.

Description: Apulian red-figure patera with anthropomorphic handle. Greek (Apulian), about 350 BC.

Description: Foot of a cista in the form of a winged youth, Etruscan, about 490 BC.

Description: Statuette of a griffin with an arimasp. Greek, 125-75 BC.

Description: Clipeus with a bust of Nike, Roman, 25 BC - AD 25.

Description: Lentoid engraved seal, Greek (Minoan), about 1400 BC – 1300 BC.
