Chaperone Guidelines for K-12 Visits



Please copy this sheet and distribute to all chaperones.

Chaperones play an important role in facilitating successful field trips. The Museum relies on each chaperone to supervise a small group of students throughout the visit.

- A minimum of 1 chaperone (non-student over age 18) per 10 students is required. A maximum of two chaperones per 10 students may accompany the Guided Tour through the galleries.
- Chaperones must stay with their assigned group of students at all times, regardless of age
 of the students.
- Upon arrival at the Museum, a School Group program representative will greet the bus and help orient the group. If arriving by car, a representative will meet the group in the Outdoor Classical Theater. Please have students bring their lunches with them.
- Remind students to leave backpacks and umbrellas on the bus.
- Remind students that food and drinks are not allowed in the galleries.
- Accompany students to the restrooms and remain with them as a monitor until all students are finished. If another school group is using the restroom, please wait until they exit.
- Please remind students to keep a safe distance from the artwork. Pens or markers are not permitted in the galleries.
- Remind students to keep a safe distance from the artwork and not point at artwork with pencils or other items. Pens or markers are not allowed in galleries.
- Light can damage works of art: flash photography is not allowed in the galleries.
- Students can re-enter the galleries with their teacher and/or chaperone if your schedules allows for time for exploration but avoid interrupting tours in progress and crowded rooms.
- Remind students to be considerate of other visitors by not blocking passageways, keeping voices down, and making room for other groups in the galleries.
- Agree on a time and place for all groups to meet and prepare for your departure.
