



Teacher Checklist for School Visits

If you have any questions about your reservation, please call our Getty School Group Scheduling team at (310) 440-7322.

- Do the <u>"Preserving Ancient Art"</u> activity to help students learn why we ask them not to touch the art on display. Ask students to help us protect the art on view by staying at least 12 inches away from works of art (including furniture on display) and being careful with pencils in the gallery. Remind them not to point at works of art with pencils.
- Practice "close looking" with your students. Do the <u>"Thirty Second Look—Getty Villa"</u> activity to help students learn the benefit of slowing down and looking closely at works of art.

UPON ARRIVAL AT THE GETTY VILLA

When you arrive at the Getty Villa, please wait on your bus and a School Group Liaison will greet you to direct your group in stowing lunches. If you arrive by car, please have students bring their lunches with them. A School Group Liaison will meet your group in the Outdoor Theater.
Before you leave your bus or car, please note that these items cannot be carried in the museum and should be left in the vehicle: • water bottles • backpacks (backpacks with emergency materials are an exception) • umbrellas • gum/food • pens and markers
Your entire school group will be separated into smaller groups for the Guided Lesson. We will tell you the exact number of groups and students per group before your Guided Lesson based on your total number of students, chaperones, and how many docents are available. Your flexibility and assistance with this process are greatly appreciated.
Agree on a time and a place for the groups to meet after they are done visiting the galleries and gardens. We suggest the Outdoor Theater.

Have a great time exploring the Getty Villa, and let our staff and volunteers know if you have any questions. We're here to help!


AFTER YOUR VISIT
