

GETTY FOUNDATION GRANTS AWARDED FY15 Quarters 1, 2 and 3

The Getty Foundation awards grants through strategic initiatives that strengthen art history as a global discipline, promote the interdisciplinary practice of conservation, increase access to museum and archival collections, and develop current and future leaders. The following grants were awarded between July 1, 2014, and March 31, 2015.

Pacific Standard Time: LA/LA

Following the collaborative model established with Pacific Standard Time: Art in L.A. 1945-1980, this Getty initiative will explore the artistic connections between Los Angeles and Latin America through a series of coordinated exhibitions and programs in 2017.
