



## **PST ART CLIMATE IMPACT PROGRAM REPORT: SECTOR COLLABORATORS**

An integral component of the PST ART Climate Impact Program was facilitating a variety of special offers and collaborations for participants. This fulfilled the objective to improve the climate impact of PST ART projects and to build community between PST ART projects and initiatives happening in the sector at-large. LHL Consulting set up the following collaborations through outreach on behalf of the Climate Impact Program.

### **Barder**

This material reuse platform for the art sector partnered with PST ART to offer a custom outreach campaign for Los Angeles connected to initiative-related material posted on the site. Over seventy items from the Los Angeles area were posted to Barder during PST ART, with dozens of requests made for that material.

### **Artists Commit**

This collective devoted to climate action in contemporary art worked with LHL to promote their material stipend and mentorship program, resulting in two PST ART projects receiving material stipend grants to offset additional costs related to climate-responsible material purchases. Those PST ART projects also posted their PST ART CIRs to the Artists Commit Climate Impact Report database. The Climate Impact Report was built from a foundation laid by LHL Consulting's work with Artists Commit.

### **Gallery Climate Coalition (GCC)**

This international community of arts organizations working to reduce the sector's environmental impacts trained PST ART Climate Impact Program participants on the GCC Carbon Calculator. The collaboration included offering PST ART CIP participants easy access to the new calculator tool regardless of institutional GCC membership.

### **Crozier Fine Arts**

This global leader in fine art logistics and services explored the viability of offering a sea freight shuttle from Europe to Los Angeles in summer 2024 to align with PST ART exhibitions.

### **Hauser & Wirth**

This leading international art gallery explored the viability of an alternative consolidated sea freight shipment with PST ART partner sites, timed around PST ART exhibitions. Building on the initial outreach conducted for the Crozier survey, LHL followed up with

project participants to assess interest in this alternative schedule that had a potential for a larger shipment size due to the addition of the PST ART gallery affiliate. In the end, there was still not a critical mass to make this a viable offering.

### **Articheck Virtual Courier**

LHL worked closely with this company that specializes in digital condition reports to offer free access to their virtual courier service for PST ART participants. They hosted an orientation meeting for any interested PST ART partner venues to introduce the service and encouraged Climate Impact Program participants to take advantage of the free service, even for projects that used in-person couriers or no couriers, as a way of becoming familiar with the software and potentially reducing the need for future in-person couriers.
